- 20% native Hojiblanca, prized for its distinctive Andalusian flavor profile;

Planted according to an intensive layout $(7 \times 5 \text{ m})$, the grove is 10 years old, placing it at the peak of its productive cycle. Annual harvest yields approximately 300,000 kg of olives, producing around 60,000 liters of extra virgin olive oil.

A drip irrigation system is already installed on 10 hectares, and technical conditions allow for expansion across the entire olive grove, unlocking further yield potential.

Financial performance:

In the most recent season, the grove generated a net profit of approximately €75,000 after covering all operational costs, including staff salaries — and this without an on-site oil mill.

Added value:

The property offers the opportunity to develop a project and apply for the necessary permits to build a private olive oil mill, which would enable higher profit margins and the launch of oleotourism activities: guided tours of the olive plantation, oil tastings, workshops, and premium-branded product sales.

Ideal as a stand-alone investment or as a strategic expansion of the neighboring estate to create a unified agri- and oleotourism complex.


